Digital Art Course Overview:

Technology changes so quickly today that students no longer can simply memorize programs and their operating systems, especially in our <u>21st Century</u> <u>Project Based Learning</u> Environment. In this Digital Art class you will gain skills to think through challenging technology projects by critically analyzing problems, creating and designing original visual representations both independently and collaboratively. To develop these skills, you will become familiar with and explore complex programs such as but not limited to:

- Photoshop / Illustrator
- Weebly / Wix / Wordpress / etc...
- Various Animation Software
- Various Movie Editing Programs

Some Essential Questions:

- 1. What is the **purpose** of art?
- 2. What are ways to **analyze** and **discuss** works of art?
- 3. How do various **cultures** experience and define art?
- 4. Why would **context** matter when interpreting art?
- 5. How can art make important contributions to society?
- 6. Why do artists produce preliminary plans?

7. How is **Digital Art** impacting current and future Art Culture?
